Ms. Enokido has devoted much of her professional career, nearly 20 years, to the growth and success of the Hay-Adams; one of the finest luxury hotels in the world. She was the chairperson for the "Japan Wow" program by the Smithsonian Associates. Currently, she is a board member for FLOC (For the Love of Children) and a Council Member for the Brookings Institution.
